Hail to our President: Glynese Floyd

Glynese didn't let retirement last too long before she took over the reins of the Lea County Commission for the Arts. Serving as secretary of LCCA for several years, prepared Glynese for the more challenging roll as president. A Bachelor's degree in theatre from Oklahoma and her Master's degree from Colorado trained her well for a lifetime of leading. She worked with the Little Theatre of the Rockies for three summers and taught theatre in elementary, junior high, high school, and college until she retired from the University of the Southwest in 2007. During her many years in educational theatre, Glynese served with five state theatre organizations, Southwest Theatre and Film Association, where she served as secretary for 6 years.

Glynese's most outstanding achievement was directing the original musical *Viva Santa Fe*, which led her and her troupe to Seville, Spain in 1992. There it was presented in a shortened version at the International Expo.

This talented director has received numerous awards, but her most prestigious was NEW MEXICO'S GOVERNOR'S AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN THE ARTS. She received her award in Santa Fe along with seven others, but hers was the only one in theatre arts.

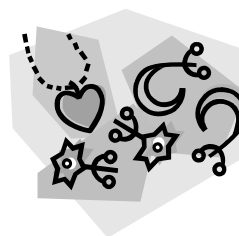
